## CIVIC ORCHESTRA'S NEW SEASON BEGINS -- IN CORDOVA BAY

Victoria's Civic Orchestra begins its 1988-89 season November 20th under the baton of a new conductor, Robert Cooper, with a program ranging from Telemann and Strauss to Gilbert & Sullivan.

Musical director Cooper is a staff member at Brentwood College, and has studied at the Royal Academy of Music in London and at the Munich Conservatory. Among his numerous operas and musicals in Victoria are Fiddler on the Roof, The Yeoman of the Guard and Amal and the Night Visitors.

The Civic's goal is to provide the opportunity for both amateur and professional musicians to perform challenging music in an atmosphere emphasizing enjoyment. Its roots can be traced to the Hampton Orchestra, which itself began for members of the Hampton Road seniors' centre. Under Charles Barber, the group grew to about 80 musicians, and the decision was made to create two orchestras -- the Hampton (still thriving) and the Civic (incorporated in May 1984). The Civic has begun several noteworthy traditions -- the Sing-It-Yourself Messiah (as much fun for the orchestra as for the audience) and the annual concerto concert.

The program at 2 pm on Sunday November 20th includes Rossini (Overture "La Gazza Ladra"), Granados (Intermezzo from Grand Opera "Goyescas"), Telemann (Viola Concerto in G Major, with John O'Riordan as soloist), Johann Strauss (Overture "Waldmeister"), Mozart (Vado ma Dove?), Gilbert & Sullivan (Tis done! I am a Bride! with Meredythe Broadway, soprano) and Bizet (Carmen Suite No. 1). The season-opening concert will be at Cordova Bay United Church, 813 Claremont Avenue.

## SECOND PAGE COLUMN

Last week a truck-route by-law came before Saanich Council for consideration. The object of a truck-route by-law is to define the roads upon which trucks can lawfully travel - and, by implication, those upon which they can't.

This by-law showed Cordova Bay Road as part of the Saanich truck-route. The rationale for including it and various other residentially-developed major streets was that the Province will not share costs of upgrading roads which forbid trucks.

Several residents of Cordova Bay Road south of Royal Oak Ave. attended and spoke out against the inclusion of Cordova Bay Road, and against trucks running through Mount Douglas Park.

McLaren, one of the owners of the Trio Pit, pointed out to Council that the rock Trio is blamed for handling is for use on municipal projects, and that 70% of the truck traffic along Cordova Bay Road is composed of municipally owned or rented trucks.

Council made a motion

- not to proceed with this particular by-law;
- that staff study the feasibility of municipal trucks using the Pat Bay Highway to access the gravel pits; and
- that the Administrative Traffic Committee work on a truck-route by-law that would ban trucks from using any residentially-developed streets in Saanich.

It carried unanimously.

A major problem with any truck-route by-law would be the difficulty of enforcing it.

When the Cordova Bay Association spoke to the Independent Truckers' Association some years ago about staying off Cordova Bay Road (the Council of that time had suggested that the problem could be solved by general good-will) the clear message we received back was that time is money, that they saved both by driving Cordova Bay Road, and that they would continue to do so.

Nevertheless, Council is trying to find a solution. Good luck to them!

## LOCHSIDE PARK FLOODED OUT!

Lochside Park isn't just the major playing field park in Cordova Bay, it's the only real playing field park in Cordova Bay. McMinn Park is so far unbuilt, and will be shared with Broadmead. "Trio" field is substandard in size, and too wet for regular use. Claremont School fields are already overused by the school's own teams. And the remaining bit of "park" is the undeveloped portion of the Victoria Water Board property south of Haliburton Road, undeveloped and unsuitable for playing field use.

For the past several years, the Cordova Bay Soccer Club has been trying to negotiate with Saanich staff for some action that would solve the severe drainage problems on the Lochside Park fields. There have been promises made, but nothing ever comes through.

The argument Saanich staff advance for this neglect is that Lochside Park does not belong to the municipality. It is part of the MacArthur Park Estate Holdings in the northern part of the community. But in fact none of the playing fields in Cordova Bay do belong to Saanich. So when Saanich says it will not pay for improvements to parks it does not own, it is saying that it will do nothing at all for Cordova Bay.

Late last month the Association wrote urgently to Saanich, asking that something be done. We have received no answer as this newsletter goes to press.

At the end of last week, four days into the soccer season, the Lochside fields were under water. More than 270 players are having to look for fields outside the community.

Do you think this is fair?

# Claremont Secondary School

A NEW RELATIONSHIP WITH BUSINESS AND EDUCATION begins with the installation of a Wang Classroom in Claremont Secondary School.

Most of the computer equipment in the Lab was donated by Wang Canada Limited. The Lab facility itself was built by School District No. 63 (Saanich), and is constructed as a simulated office. People involved believe it to be the most advanced computer classroom design they have seen to date. The program that will be taught to students is industry-standard and, in fact, is fully compatible with all Wang equipment in present use in government and industry.

Schools have a great deal to learn from the world of the business community. This Wang installation will provide an opportunity for interested businesses to network directly with the school, providing a real-life lab in the school setting. This means that students will be able to directly learn the regular tools of business (such as word-processing, accounting procedures, inventory control, purchasing and sales projections, etc.).

In Addition, students will have the opportunity to co-operate with the business community, thus connecting theory with practice. This would involve such concepts as business leadership and management, confidence in decision-making, action-taking, etc.

## WHAT YOU TOLD US ABOUT THE CORDOVAN
