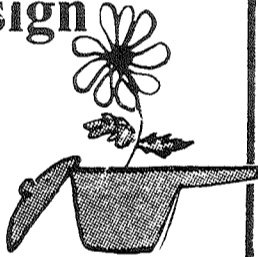

Planning Briefs

Cordova Bay Road Streetscape

A meeting between the community and planning and engineering staff of Saanich took place on May 14th. Under discussion was the latest streetscape proposal, brought forward by Saanich in response to discussions at a previous meeting in late 1991.

This present proposal includes a left-turn lane at Doumac, which the Engineering Department insists on. The Planning Department, Arni Fullerton (the streetscape architect) and the community support a two-lane road with no left turn lanes. There is no proven traffic need for a left-turn lane.

Representatives of residents along Cordova Bay Road presented their own proposal. It includes a broad combined bicycle/walking strip along the east side of much of the road, and some angle parking as well as parallel parking. Planning expressed concern about the combination of sidewalk and bike path. The Engineering Department opposes the angle parking.

Discussions continue, with the next meeting set for June 11. It seems unlikely that residents and the Engineering Department will reach agreement on Cordova Bay Road, so it is likely to become a hot political issue.

Development at Claremont

On May 26, Saanich Council will be considering an application to remove land north of Claremont School (on the southwest corner of Claremont and Wesley Roads) from the Agricultural Land Reserve, for the purpose of expanding services at Claremont High School. It has long been known that the school needs to be enlarged: what is not clear is whether the expansion is to include the theatre originally proposed for the site, and whether the expanded playing fields are designed solely for Claremont or generally for S.D. 63 schools. Clarification of these matters might help to reduce the tension that exists in the neighbourhood of the school.

Compost in the Municipal Pit?

On May 26 Saanich Council will reconsider rezoning the municipal pit from Agricultural to Temporary Industrial, to permit the municipality to carry on composting on the site. Residents will be at the meeting to express their concern. Cliff Jones, Chairman of the C.B.A. Planning Committee will suggest that this rezoning will draw even more truck traffic to the area, and that, in any case, even a temporary industrial zoning should not be permitted in such a sensitive area.

The Conserver Society Wants YOU!

By 1995, the Capital Regional District wants to reduce garbage going to the landfill by 50%.

Just a few years ago, lots of people would have laughed at the idea. There may be some who still do, but most of us know that it won't be long before we'll regard 50% as a modest reduction.

The Capital Regional District has already undertaken these initiatives.

User Pay Garbage Collection

Already implemented in Victoria, Saanich, Esquimalt and Oak Bay, this is intended as an incentive for all of us to cut down on the amount of garbage we generate, and to divert more material to recycling programs.

The second phase of the program will include refinements such as compensating "conserver" households—those that generate less-than-allowable levels of garbage.

Home Composting

Launched May 2, this gave you a chance to buy one of 10,000 subsidized home composters, available for \$25.00 on a first-come first serve-basis. More than 5000 units sold in about 5 days and the second shipment sold almost as quickly.

Here are ways you can reduce waste:

- * Don't buy things in packaging that can't be recycled.
- * Take yard and garden waste to the Saanich Municipal Yard at 1040 McKenzie Avenue. Depot hours are Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. and Saturday, 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.
- * Or take it to Hartland Landfill at a cost of \$15/tonne.
- * Saanich Municipal yard also accepts
 - newspaper
 - glass bottle and jars
 - food and beverage cans
 - plastic bottles
 - corrugated cardboard
 - magazines/catalogues/phonebooks
 - cardboard egg cartons
 - paper bags
 - office paper/envelopes/glossy paper
- * Join the CRD Volunteer Speakers' Bureau and help pass the word.
- * Join a community environmental group or start one of your own. (for example. Fairfield Community members rotate the responsibility of collecting "non-blue-box" recyclables and dropping them off at the Victoria drop-off depot on Garbally Road, thus saving gas, time and energy resources.
- * Call the CRD Hotline at 360-3030 for a copy of the CRD recycling directory of listings of local recycling companies—or for detailed information on recyclables.
- * Send in this coupon to the CRD.
- * Adopt a conserver lifestyle. It all starts at the grass roots, with you.

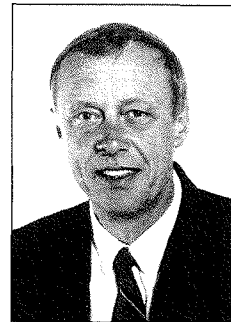

Friends of Mount Douglas Park

At the Claremont meeting of Saanich Council concerning Cordova Bay Road through Mount Douglas Park, Council was overwhelmingly in favour of preserving the present road rather than closing it off entirely or building a new road on a different alignment. The present road is, of course, still potentially hazardous, and Saanich proposes to deal with this by various measures, beginning with what they call "alcove A", the worst of four gullies that threaten the roadbed and those who drive on it.

Within the next month or so, the engineering department will bring forward detailed plans for "alcove A".

At that same meeting, Council stated that the road through the park should be thought of as a park road, rather than just another major road.

In view of this, the Friends have written to Mayor and Council with a statement of goals and objectives for the road. It is a lengthy statement, and space doesn't permit us to print them all here, but they include:

- maintain the heritage of Mount Douglas Park through limited and cautious change.
- recognize Mount Douglas Park, from summit to sea, as a Wilderness Preserve.
- enhance the Park as a destination to be enjoyed by members of the community instead of something to be crossed in transit;
- provide a balance between the Park setting and urban transportation needs;
- ensure that non-automobile users of this park road can do so safely and without being deprived of any of the Park's benefits;
- protect the avenue of trees and its canopy by maintaining the present two lane status and incorporating bicycle lanes within the existing tree boundaries;
- re-establish and enforce the reduced automobile speed limit on this park road;
- continue to exclude truck traffic on this park road.

Specifically, they ask Council to introduce—on a two-year trial basis—"road humps": these are at use in England, and unlike our speed bumps are not felt at posted speeds, but only have effect at excessive speeds. They are no hinderance to traffic, including emergency vehicles.
